## Petro Waste Environmental Aims for Smaller Carbon Footprint Texas Waste Company Looks to Better the Environment

San Antonio, Texas (August 2014) – Petro Waste Environmental (PWE), a new San Antonio based company that processes non-hazardous oilfield drilling by-products, announces its proposed state-of-the-art facility located in Dewitt County, half a mile outside of Nordheim, Texas. PWE has formed a strategic alliance with Pyote Water Systems.

"PWE's services are an integral part of the drilling process during this exciting time in the Texas oil and gas industry," said George Wommack, CEO of PWE. In 2011 alone, the oil industry produced directly and indirectly an economic output of \$1,629,619,284 to DeWitt County. The local government revenue to the county in 2011 was \$22,178,328, not including the school district tax revenue. In addition to contributing to the economic impact of DeWitt County and the community, PWE will also be supporting local merchants and bringing new jobs to the area. In 2014 alone, it is projected that 200 additional wells will be drilled in DeWitt County. By 2021 the projected total economic output for DeWitt County is \$7,534,000,000.

The proposed facility, centrally located 75 miles closer than similar facilities, is estimated to result in 675,000 fewer miles traveled by transport trucks each year, which will lessen wear and tear on the county highways and reduce impact to the environment. Because all PWE locations will be near customers' drilling acreage, transportation costs are substantially reduced.

PWE has positioned itself to become one of the largest, strategically located network of oilfield waste processing and disposal facilities in the country. The company has exclusive access to select Pyote locations serving the Permian and Eagle Ford plays and will continue adding solid waste facilities to the already established saltwater disposal locations. Building solid waste facilities adjacent to existing saltwater disposal infrastructure will allow all oilfield waste disposal to be handled through

one convenient location, making the geographical footprint larger while creating a smaller carbon footprint.

PWE is dedicated to high standards of safety and compliance. The company is working with the best engineering firms to create state-of-the-art facilities using world-class technology including high-tech automation and monitoring systems, which supplement the functions of onsite personnel.
